Mrs. George W. Vernon

Mrs. George W. Vernon, ^K69, mother of John F. Vernon ^N of Chadds Ford, died Saturday, apparently of a heart attack, ^A in Pasadena, Calif., where she had lived for about 12 years. ^f Mrs. Vernon formerly lived in Wilmington where her late husband was a wholesale-retail newspaper dealer on Shipley Street. She operated the business with her son after her husband's death.

The Wilmington, Delaware, Morning News of to-day says: Before Register of Wills Crossan yesterday the will of George W. Vernon, the veteran editor of the Daily Republican, was filed for probate by Howell S. England, the attorney for the executors. Almost immediately after William S. Hilles, counsel for Howard, Fillmore, Abner and W. Scott Vernon filed a caveat against the will and the case will be heard later on.

Under the will of Mr. Vernon his estate of \$50,000 is left to the widow during her life time. The Daily Republican building at Third and King streets, is left to the eight sons, provided that they pay the widow \$20 a week during her life time, but all the property at the death of Mrs. Vernon goes to her children, Walter, Wesley, Frank, Clarence, Mabel and Nellie Vernon, and the other four sons, who are by a previous marriage, receive nothing. It is to this feature of the will that objection is made by the four sons named. The widow
